GOAL: applaud the study and highlight how it aligns w elements of our business strategy;

MESSAGES:

- Applaud Princeton team for 2 years of research outlining a credible path that helps policymakers make net zero by 2050 a reality
- Highlight how the Princeton findings align with key elements of bp's strategy, including our focus on CCUS, hydrogen and key renewables, including wind and solar.
- Commit to working with partners around the world to help make net zero a reality.

Hello Mary, Rachel and Bob

Hope you're all well.

The nub of it: I wanted to make you aware of an announcement that Princeton University are making on 15th Dec. They are releasing the findings of their 2-year study called Net Zero America which outlines a practical blueprint for the complete transformation of America's energy system to reach net-zero greenhouse gas emissions over thirty years. It offers five scenarios representing a diversity of technology mixes, each of which could achieve net-zero emissions for the country by 2050, along with many sensitivity cases to explore the impact of key uncertainties.

And this is important because ...?: This is a significant and timely piece of work, and one that clearly plays to Biden's green agenda. In fact, the team that worked on this are already advising Biden's transition team.

And this is relevant to bp because ...?: Just under \$2m of this study's funding came from by bp through its Climate Mitigation Initiative (CMI). The press release fact sheet namechecks us. It also plays to our aims of helping the world get to net zero – and in this case, perhaps the most important country if we are to achieve this.

Next steps: I think this warrants a conversation on how we can leverage this. We don't have long – it's being released on the 15th. Could we have a chat tomorrow? I'm available for the next 2 hours, if any of you want a chat before, but I thought it made sense for us all to get together.
