Hi both,

I had intended to reach out to you to discuss the US university policy partnerships in due course but it hadn't seemed a priority just now. However, now that Jess has raised it, we should catch up.

The relationship was historically between Group Policy and Harvard, and later also Tufts, most recently also with Columbia, with the focus on global climate policy. Redacted - First Amendment

Redacted - First Amendment Since 2012 Dev has been and remains the executive sponsor.

Going forward, we have the following considerations:

- I hold the budget for all three partnerships.
- All three are up for renewal/revision/termination at the end of this year (see attachments), so we will need to decide collectively whether and how to continue them, and what focus. Casey is developing a partnerships strategy so this set of partnerships should be considered within that.
- Katrina is on maternity leave until the summer – but will not be the appropriate lead in her new role (VP Environment) when she returns.
- I could manage the relationships – but am leaving myself June 30, so probably not the right choice.
- Given that Jeff is our new climate policy SME and the partnerships are all climate-focused he seems the obvious choice.

Does the above sound right to you? If so, who from DC should work with Jeff?

Happy to talk through before progressing further but good to get a sense of your thinking.
