Dear Mr. Goodell:

I write with regard to the National Football League's (NFL) investigation into allegations of sexual misconduct and financial malfeasance against Washington Commanders owner Daniel Snyder. More than a year has passed since your pledge to "share the results of that investigation," yet, to date, no part of the information has been released to the public. In light of the impending sale of the Commanders franchise, I urge you to honor your commitment to release the report in its entirety and "take additional disciplinary action if warranted."¹

In February 2022, following Committee Democrats' roundtable with former Commanders employees regarding the organization's toxic workplace culture, the NFL announced it had retained Mary Jo White, a former U.S. Attorney and Chair of the Securities and Exchange Commission, to investigate new allegations of sexual misconduct against Mr. Snyder. The League confirmed that Ms. White's findings would be released publicly at the conclusion of her investigation and that you would personally determine whether the League would "take any further disciplinary action."² In April 2022, after Committee Democrats referred to federal and state law enforcement agencies new evidence that the Commanders may have engaged in financial misconduct, including intentionally withholding millions of dollars in refundable security deposits owed to customers and concealing revenue from the NFL to evade the team's obligations under the League's revenue-sharing agreement, the League confirmed that Ms. White's investigation would expand to include these new allegations.³

I understand from reports that Ms. White has informed lawyers and witnesses who agreed to participate in her investigation that she expects the NFL to release her full report—and not just the findings—to the public.⁴ I am heartened by this stated commitment to full transparency, which is not only consistent with League precedent and your admirable commitments to this Committee but necessary given the "extraordinary public interest in this matter."⁵

As you have previously recognized, with one of the most prominent platforms in America, "the NFL is held to a higher standard, and properly so."⁶ You now have an opportunity to show the American people—and, most importantly, the victims of the Commanders' toxic workplace—that you will adhere to this higher standard by ensuring transparency and accountability, by releasing Ms. White's full report, and by taking additional action consistent with the findings of the report.

The Committee on Oversight and Accountability is the principal oversight committee of the House of Representatives and has broad authority to investigate "any matter" at "any time" under House Rule X.
