  - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Access for Veterans5 to Records Act".

## 1SEC. 2. PLAN TO ELIMINATE RECORDS BACKLOG AT THE2NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER.

3 (a) PLAN REQUIRED.—Not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Archivist of the 4 5 United States shall submit to the Committee on Oversight and Reform of the House of Representatives and the 6 7 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee of the Senate a plan for reducing the backlog of requests 8 for records from the National Personnel Records Center 9 that includes, at a minimum, the following: 10

11 (1) Target timeframes to reduce the backlog.

12 (2) A detailed plan for improving the informa13 tion technology infrastructure to prevent future
14 backlogs.

15 (3) Actions to improve customer service for re-16 questers.

17 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.-In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is authorized 18 19 to be appropriated to the National Archives and Records 20 Administration, \$60,000,000 to address backlogs in re-21 sponding to requests from veterans for military personnel 22 records, improve cybersecurity, improve digital preserva-23 tion and access to archival Federal records, and address 24 backlogs in requests made under section 552 of title 5, United States Code (commonly referred to as the Freedom 25

- 1 of Information Act). Such amounts may also be used for
- $2 \ \ {\rm the \ Federal \ Records \ Center \ Program}.$
