 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair and Accurate5 Census Act".

6 SEC. 2. CENSUS DEADLINE MODIFICATION.

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22(a) of the Act entitled "An Act to provide for the fif teenth and subsequent decennial censuses and to provide
 for an apportionment of Representatives in Congress", ap proved June 18, 1929 (2 U.S.C. 2a(a)), for the 2020 de cennial census of the population—

- 6 (1) the tabulation of total population by States 7 required by section 141(a) of such title for the ap-8 portionment of Representatives in Congress among 9 the several States shall be completed and reported 10 by the Secretary to the President within 13 months 11 after the decennial census date of April 1, 2020, and 12 shall be made public by the Secretary no later than 13 the date on which it is reported to the President;
- 14 (2) the President shall transmit to the Congress 15 a statement showing the whole number of persons in 16 each State, and the number of Representatives to 17 which each State would be entitled under an appor-18 tionment of the then existing number of Representa-19 tives, as required by such section 22(a), and deter-20 mined solely as described therein, within 14 days 21 after receipt of the tabulation reported by the Sec-22 retary; and

section 141(c) of such title shall be completed by the
Secretary as expeditiously as possible after the cen-

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1 sus date of April 1, 2020, taking into account each 2 State's deadlines for legislative apportionment or 3 districting, and reported to the Governor of the 4 State involved and to the officers or public bodies 5 having responsibility for legislative apportionment or 6 districting of such State, except that such tabula-7 tions of population of each State requesting a tab-8 ulation plan, and basic tabulations of population of 9 each other State, shall be completed, reported, and 10 transmitted to each respective State within 16 11 months after the decennial census date of April 1, 12 2020.

13 SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR 2020 CENSUS.

14 On the first day of each month during the period be-15 tween the date of enactment of this Act and July 1, 2021, 16 the Director of the Bureau of the Census shall submit, to the Committee on Oversight and Reform of the House 17 18 of Representatives, the Committee on Homeland Security 19 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate, and the Commit-20 tees on Appropriations of the House and the Senate, a 21 report regarding the 2020 decennial census of population 22 containing the following information:

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Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974"), an institu tion of higher education may, in furtherance of a full and
 accurate decennial census of population count, provide to
 the Bureau of the Census information requested by the
 Bureau for purposes of enumeration for the 2020 decen nial census of population.

7 (b) Application.—

8 (1) INFORMATION.—Only information requested 9 on the official 2020 decennial census of population 10 form may be provided to the Bureau of the Census 11 pursuant to this section. No institution of higher 12 education may provide any information to the Bu-13 reau on the immigration or citizenship status of any 14 individual.

15 (2)NOTICE REQUIRED.—Before information 16 can be provided to the Bureau, the institution of 17 higher education shall give public notice of the cat-18 egories of information which it plans to provide and 19 shall allow 10 days after such notice has been given 20 for a student to inform the institution that any or 21 all of the information designated should not be re-22 leased without the student's prior consent. No insti-23 tution of higher education shall provide the Bureau 24 with the information of any individual who has ob-25 jected to the provision of such information.

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(3) USE OF INFORMATION.—Information pro vided to the Bureau pursuant to this section may
 only be used for the purposes of enumeration for the
 2020 decennial census of population.

5 (c) DEFINITION OF INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDU6 CATION.—In this section, the term "institution of higher
7 education" has the meaning given that term in section 102
8 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002).

9 (d) SUNSET.—The authority provided in this section
10 shall expire at the conclusion of 2020 census operations.
11 SEC. 5. LIMITATION.

12 The Bureau of the Census may not compile, produce, 13 or publish any data product or tabulation as part of, in 14 combination with, or in connection with, the 2020 decen-15 nial census of population or any such census data produced pursuant to section 141(c) of title 13, United States 16 17 Code, that includes topics specific to the 2020 Census that 18 were not part of the report submitted pursuant to section 19 141(f)(1) of title 13, United States Code, on March 28, 20 2017, and the 2018 End-to-End Census Test conducted 21 in Providence County, Rhode Island.
