A BILL

- To require the Archivist of the United States to submit a plan to Congress to eliminate the records backlog at the National Personnel Records Center, and for other purposes.

 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Access for Veterans3 to Records Act of 2022".

4 SEC. 2. PLAN TO ELIMINATE RECORDS BACKLOG AT THE

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NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER.

6 (a) PLAN REQUIRED.—Not later than 60 days after 7 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Archivist of the 8 United States shall submit to the appropriate congres-9 sional committees a comprehensive plan for reducing the backlog of requests for records from the National Per-10 11 sonnel Records Center and improving the efficiency and responsiveness of operations at the National Personnel 12 13 Records Center, that includes, at a minimum, the following: 14

15 (1) An estimate of the number of backlogged16 record requests for veterans.

17 (2) Target timeframes to reduce the backlog.

18 (3) A detailed plan for using existing funds to
19 improve the information technology infrastructure,
20 including secure access to appropriate agency Fed21 eral records, to prevent future backlogs.

(4) Actions to improve customer service for re-questers.

24 (5) Measurable goals with respect to the com25 prehensive plan and metrics for tracking progress
26 toward such goals.

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(6) Strategies to prevent future record request
 backlogs, including backlogs caused by an event that
 prevents employees of the Center from reporting to
 work in person.

5 (b) UPDATES.—Not later than 90 days after the date on which the comprehensive plan is submitted under sub-6 7 section (a), and biannually thereafter until the response 8 rate by the National Personnel Records Center reaches 90 9 percent of all requests in 20 days or less, not including 10 any request involving a record damaged or lost in the National Personnel Records Center fire of 1973 or any re-11 12 quest that is subject to a fee that has not been paid in 13 a timely manner by the requestor (provided the National Personnel Records Center issues an invoice within 20 days 14 15 after the date on which the request is made), the Archivist of the United States shall submit to the appropriate con-16 17 gressional committees an update of such plan that—

(1) describes progress made by the National
Personnel Records Center during the preceding 90day period with respect to record request backlog reduction and efficiency and responsiveness improvement;

(2) provides data on progress made toward thegoals identified in the comprehensive plan; and

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(3) describes any changes made to the com prehensive plan.

3 (c) CONSULTATION REQUIREMENT.—In carrying out
4 subsections (a) and (b), the Archivist of the United States
5 shall consult with the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

6 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
7 DEFINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate con8 gressional committees" means—

9 (1) the Committee on Oversight and Reform
10 and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
11 House of Representatives; and

(2) the Committee on Homeland Security and
Governmental Affairs and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate.

15 SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO ADDRESS RECORDS
16 BACKLOG.

17 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is authorized 18 to be appropriated to the National Archives and Records 19 Administration, \$60,000,000 to address backlogs in re-20 21 sponding to requests from veterans for military personnel 22 records, improve cybersecurity, improve digital preservation and access to archival Federal records, and address 23 24 backlogs in requests made under section 552 of title 5, United States Code (commonly referred to as the Freedom 25

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of Information Act). Such amounts may also be used for
 the Federal Records Center Program.

3 (b) REQUIREMENT TO MAINTAIN IN-PERSON STAFF-4 ING LEVELS.—Not later than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Archivist of the United 5 States shall ensure that the National Personnel Records 6 7 Center maintains staffing levels and telework arrange-8 ments that enable the maximum processing of records re-9 quests possible in order to achieve the performance goal 10 of responding to 90 percent of all requests in 20 days or less, not including any request involving a record damaged 11 or lost in the National Personnel Records Center fire of 12 1973 or any request that is subject to a fee that has not 13 been paid in a timely manner by the requestor (provided 14 15 the National Personnel Records Center issues an invoice within 20 days after the date on which the request is 16 made). 17

(c) INSPECTOR GENERAL REPORTING.—The Inspector General for the National Archives and Records Administration shall, for two years following the date of the enactment of this Act, include in every semiannual report
submitted to Congress pursuant to the Inspector General
Act of 1978, a detailed summary of—

24 (1) efforts taken by the National Archives and
25 Records Administration to address the backlog of

records requests at the National Personnel Records
 Center; and

3 (2) any recommendations for action proposed
4 by the Inspector General related to reducing the
5 backlog of records requests at the National Per6 sonnel Records Center and the status of compliance
7 with those recommendations by the National Ar8 chives and Records Administration.
