То	amend title 13, United States Code, to improve the operations of the Bureau of the Census, and for other purposes.
1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring a Fair and
5	Accurate Census Act".
6	SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN BUREAU OF THE CEN-
7	SUS AUTHORITIES.

(a) Budget Requests.—

(1) In general.—Subchapter I of chapter 1 of
title 13, United States Code, is amended by insert-
ing after section 13 the following:
"§ 14. Budget requests
"(a) With respect to the budget request of the Bu-
reau for fiscal year 2027 and each fiscal year thereafter
submitted to the President for inclusion in the annual
budget submission under section 1105(a) of title 31, the
Secretary shall include in such request the estimated costs
of carrying out the duties of the Bureau during the five-
year period beginning on the fiscal year covered by such
request.
"(b) On the date that the estimate of costs are sub-
mitted to the President under subsection (a), the Sec-
retary shall submit such estimate to the Committee on
Oversight and Reform of the House of Representatives,
the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
Affairs of the Senate, the Committees on the Budget of
the House of Representatives and the Senate, and the
Committees on Appropriations of the House of Represent-
atives and the Senate.".
(2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-
tions for such subchapter is amended by inserting
after the item relating to section 13 the following
new item:

"14. Budget requests.".

1	(b) For-cause Removal of Director; Duties.—
2	Section 21 of title 13, United States Code, is amended—
3	(1) in subsection (b)(3), by inserting after "the
4	President" the following: "only for inefficiency, ne-
5	glect of duty, or malfeasance in office"; and
6	(2) by amending subsection (c) to read as fol-
7	lows:
8	"(c) Duties.—
9	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Director shall perform
10	such duties as may be imposed upon the Director by
11	law, regulations, or orders of the Secretary. The Di-
12	rector shall report directly to the Deputy Secretary
13	of Commerce.
14	"(2) Decennial census.—Any operational,
15	statistical, or technical decision for any decennial
16	census of population may be made only by the Direc-
17	tor.".
18	(c) Advisory Committees; Deputy Director.—
19	(1) In general.—Section 21 of title 13,
20	United States Code, as amended by subsection (b),
21	is further amended—
22	(A) in the section heading, by striking
23	"duties" and inserting "Deputy Director;
24	advisory committees"; and
25	(B) by adding at the end the following:

1 "	(d) Deputy	DIRECTOR.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—There shall be in the Bureau a single Deputy Director of the Bureau, to be appointed by the Director. The position of Deputy Director shall be a career reserved position (as that term is defined in section 3132(a)(8) of title 5). The Deputy Director shall be selected from among any career appointee (as that term is defined in section 3132(a)(4) of such title) at any agency. The individual appointed to the position of Deputy Director shall possess knowledge of, or experience in, the work of the Bureau, and possess experience in relevant fields, including demography, economics, survey methodology, statistics, or data science.

- "(2) Functions.—The Deputy Director shall perform such functions as the Director shall designate. During any absence or disability of the Director, the Deputy Director shall act as Director.
- "(3) Vacancy.—In the event of a vacancy in the office of Director, or when the Director is absent or unable to serve, the Deputy Director shall act as Director until a Director is appointed. If no individual is serving as Deputy Director, the highest level career employee of the Bureau shall act as Director until a Deputy Director or Director is ap-

1	pointed. This paragraph shall serve as the exclusive
2	means of designating an acting Director.
3	"(e) Advisory Committees.—
4	"(1) General Authority.—In accordance
5	with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C
6	App.), and subject to paragraph (2), the Director
7	may establish advisory committees to provide advice
8	with respect to the mission of the Bureau. Members
9	of any such committee, including a committee estab-
10	lished under paragraph (2), shall serve without com-
11	pensation, but shall be entitled to transportation ex-
12	penses and per diem in lieu of subsistence in accord-
13	ance with section 5703 of title 5.
14	"(2) Specific advisory committees.—
15	"(A) Bureau of the census advisory
16	COMMITTEE ON STATISTICAL QUALITY STAND-
17	ARDS.—The Director shall appoint a committee
18	to be known as the 'Advisory Committee or
19	Statistical Quality Standards', composed of five
20	members to review and provide recommenda-
21	tions on the statistical quality standards of the
22	Bureau that guide the production and release of
23	all Bureau decennial census products.
24	"(B) NATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
25	AND SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—There

1	are hereby established the Bureau of the Cen-
2	sus Scientific Advisory Committee and the Cen-
3	sus Bureau National Advisory Committee on
4	Racial, Ethnic, and Other Populations, as de-
5	scribed in the charters for each such committee
6	published on March 15, 2022, and March 23,
7	2022, respectively, or any subsequent charters.
8	Such advisory committees shall operate under
9	the terms and conditions set forth in the appli-
10	cable charter.
11	"(C) 2030 CENSUS ADVISORY COM-
12	MITTEE.—The Director shall appoint an advi-
13	sory committee, substantially similar to the
14	2010 Census Advisory Committee, consisting of
15	up to 20 member organizations to address pol-
16	icy, research, and technical issues related to the
17	design and implementation of the 2030 decen-
18	nial census and the American Community Sur-
19	vey.".
20	(2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-
21	tions for subchapter II of chapter 1 of such title is
22	amended by striking the item relating to section 21
23	and inserting the following:
	"21. Director of the Census; Deputy Director.".
24	(d) Position Requirements.—Section 22 of title
2.5	13. United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) by striking "All permanent" and inserting
2	"(a) In General.—All permanent"; and
3	(2) by adding at the end the following:
4	"(b) Positions.—Each position within the Bureau
5	shall be a career position within the civil service, except
6	for the position of the Director and not more than two
7	other positions.".
8	SEC. 3. LIMITATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DE-
9	CENNIAL CENSUS.
10	Section 141 of title 13, United States Code, is
11	amended—
12	(1) by redesignating subsection (g) as sub-
13	section (h); and
14	(2) by inserting after subsection (f) the fol-
15	lowing:
16	"(g) Limitations and Requirements.—
17	"(1) Notice to congress of subjects,
18	TYPES OF INFORMATION, AND QUESTIONS.—In the
19	2030 decennial census of population and each decen-
20	nial census thereafter, the Secretary may not include
21	any subject, type of information, or question that
22	was not submitted to Congress in accordance with
23	subsection (f).
24	"(2) Biannual reports.—

1	"(A) Submission to congress.—Not
2	later than April 1 of the calendar year begin-
3	ning after the date of enactment of the Ensur-
4	ing a Fair and Accurate Census Act and bian-
5	nually thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to
6	Congress a report that—
7	"(i) describes each component of the
8	operational plan for the subsequent decen-
9	nial census of population; and
10	"(ii) includes a detailed statement on
11	the status of all research, testing, and op-
12	erations that are part of the Bureau's com-
13	prehensive plan for the decennial census.
14	"(B) INTERNET PUBLICATION.—On the
15	date on which the Secretary submits a report
16	under subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall
17	publish the report on the public internet website
18	of the Bureau.
19	"(3) Secretary certification.—
20	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, upon
21	the date of submission of the report required by
22	subsection (f)(2), shall submit, to the commit-
23	tees of Congress having legislative jurisdiction
24	over the census, a certification stating that any
25	question that has not appeared on the previous

1	two decennial censuses has been researched,
2	studied, and tested according to established sta-
3	tistical policies and procedures.
4	"(B) GAO REVIEW.—Not later than 6
5	months after the Secretary submits a certifi-
6	cation under paragraph (2), the Comptroller
7	General of the United States shall review such
8	certification and submit a report to Congress on
9	whether the questions to be included in the cen-
10	sus have been researched, studied, and tested
11	according to established statistical policies and
12	procedures."; and
13	(3) in subsection (h), as so redesignated, by in-
14	serting "Definition.—" before "As used in".
