Dear Mr Nicholas,

In tomorrow's Financial Times (the UK version) over 75 civil society organisations are publishing an open letter (attached) to the chairs of the major, publicly-listed fossil fuel companies BP, Chevron, Eni, ExxonMobil, Shell, Statoil, and Total to invite them to align their business plans to the agreement made at COP21 to limit climate change to 2C and preferably 1.5C above pre-industrial levels and achieve net zero emissions.

Publishing this letter is an important act. Your company holds immense power over whether the world achieves the agreement reached at COP21. We are asking you to use that power in the interests of your shareholders and humanity by committing to work to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in line with the budget set within COP21 and to increase the speed of the transition to a zero carbon economy in ways that does not sacrifice people's health or quality of life.

We look forward to receiving a response from Mr Svanberg.
