

David – I hope you and Fran are doing well! I'm trying to organize the keynote panel for the 2020 annual conference of the Air & Waste Management Association in San Francisco. The recent announcement by BP (<u>https://www.wsj.com/articles/bp-wants-to-be-carbon-neutral-by-2050-11581517147</u>) caught my eye, because one of the slots on the panel is for someone from an integrated oil company who would talk about the challenges they face in attempting to transform a petroleum fuel supplier into a broader energy supplier. I've attempted to find speakers from Chevron or Shell, but so far with little success. A simple outline of the panel follows.

The Air & Waste Management Association's 2020 Annual Conference and Exhibition (ACE) will be held at the Hyatt Regency Embarcadero in San Francisco June 29 to July 2, 2020. The theme for the conference is Gateway to Innovation, and we are assembling a Keynote Speaker Panel on the topic of Environmental Challenges for the Transportation Sector. The speakers for that panel include the following:

• Electrical Generation/Grid Management – challenges in integrating variable generation resources (such as wind and solar), and added challenges integrating variable demand (transportation sources that can and will recharge at almost any time). Delphine Hou, Director of California Regulatory Affairs for CAISO has agreed to participate in the panel in this topic.

• Electric Vehicle Production – unique environmental challenges associated with large-scale production of electric vehicles. Laurie Shelby, VP for EHS at Tesla Motors has agreed to participate in the panel on this topic.

• Fuel Production – challenges in transforming a petroleum fuels supplier into (more broadly) an energy supplier. This is where I'm looking for help from you.

• Fuel Distribution – challenges in developing a complete, parallel retail fuel distribution network for new transportation energy fuels. Still researching potential speakers for this topic.

• Panelist-without-a-portfolio - Severin Borenstein, a Professor of Business Administration and Public Policy at the Haas School of Business, UC Berkeley. His research focuses on business competition, strategy, and regulation,

particularly in the energy area. He was one of the members of CARB's advisory committee on California's GHG cap-andtrade program.

We would anticipate that each panelist would speak for about 10 minutes. At the conclusion of all of the presentations, we anticipate a robust (but moderated) Q&A session involving the panelists and, if time allows, members of the audience. Total time for this session would be about two hours: Tuesday, June 30, between 8:30 and 10:30 am.

I'm looking for help in finding a speaker for the third topic – challenges in transforming a petroleum fuels supplier into a broader energy supplier. Issues for this topic could include technical/regulatory/market challenges, ways to reduce the carbon footprint associated with petroleum fuels (without eliminating petroleum fuels), becoming a multi-fuel (or multi-energy-resource) provider, and other issues that keep one awake at night. This is a national conference, and so the focus need not be on California. If you know of anyone at BP who might be interested in this as a forum for presenting/discussing their plans, please let me know.
