DWH

--The teaser trailer for the DWH Hollywood movie – called Deepwater Horizon – was released last week with Hollywood trade media covering it. You can watch it here: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8yASbM8M2vg> We did not engage with reporters who raised questions.

--The federal government's lawyers last week formally asked Judge Barbier to accept the DWH settlement. The court filing last week included thousands of pages of exhibits, including statements gathered during a public comment period. We expect Barbier to approve the consent degree in April.

SAFETY CAMPAIGN

--It launches April 3 on Sunday morning news programs across the U.S.

--Geoff will send a note to GLs and SLLs on Friday with a heads up. John Minge will follow on Monday, April 4, with a

note to all U.S. employees reinforcing our commitment to safe and reliable operations.

--We're putting the final touches on the paid/owned/earned campaign elements and the roll out plan.

GULF OF MEXICO

--Lease sale was last week in New Orleans. It offered up about 45 million acres in the Central and Eastern Gulf.

--We are the apparent high bidder on 19 of the 21 leases that we submitted bids on for a total net payment of \$19,203,443.71.

--Most of the news coverage is focused on "keep it in the ground" protests that delayed the lease sale but this Houston Chronicle article below notes that winning bids totaled \$156.4 million, the fourth lowest total in the Gulf's Central District since 1983.

UPSTREAM

--Upstream employees in Houston were sent an email last week informing them of how they would find out this week whether their job will still exist. That email was leaked externally and generated chatter on at least one website.

--Individual meetings will occur this week on the Houston campus.

--Alaska has been addressing the same over the past few weeks in conjunction with the announcements of going from five rigs to two.

PETROCHEMICALS

--The Decatur plant sale to Indorama Ventures Public Company Limited will be finalized over the next two weeks.

CLIMATE

--The state investigations into whether Exxon Mobil lied about the risks of climate change may expand to New Jersey, where a lawmaker and a coalition of environmental groups are calling on the state's attorney general to investigate. You'll recall that investigations are under way in New York and California already and that the FBI has taken preliminary steps to see if a full investigation is warranted.

--The Rockefeller Family Fund — a small endowment established in 1967 by grandchildren of John D. Rockefeller Sr., co-founder of Standard Oil, a precursor to Exxon — said it would divest its slender holdings in fossil fuels as "quickly as possible."

--The Securities and Exchange Commission has told Exxon Mobil it must include a resolution on its annual shareholder proxy that, if approved, would force the company to outline for investors how its profitability may be affected by climate change and the legislation that aims to combat it. Exxon Mobil said it would "provide the board's position on the shareholder resolutions in our proxy document, which will be distributed to shareholders next month."

--Donald Trump told The Washington Post editorial board that he's "not a big believer" in human-caused climate change; instead, he believes "our biggest form of climate change we should worry about is nuclear weapons."

--Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, a Republican from Kentucky, is telling state officials to stop their work toward complying with the Clean Power Plan. In a Monday letter to all of the country's governors through the National Governors Association, McConnell said the Supreme Court's decision last month to halt the Clean Power Plan validated his earlier advice for states to ignore the regulation and not try to comply. McConnell told the governors that he's always felt the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) carbon limits violate the law.
