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Subject: Updated coal retirements (as of November 6)

Attached are (1) Vicky's November update of coal unit retirements and (2) a map showing states with retiring coal capacity (also pasted below).

Retirements attributed by unit owners to EPA policies —

- 14 more units have been added since June ... the total is now 445 units.
- These additional units represent 2,300 MW ... the total is now 72,400 MW (23% of the coal fleet).

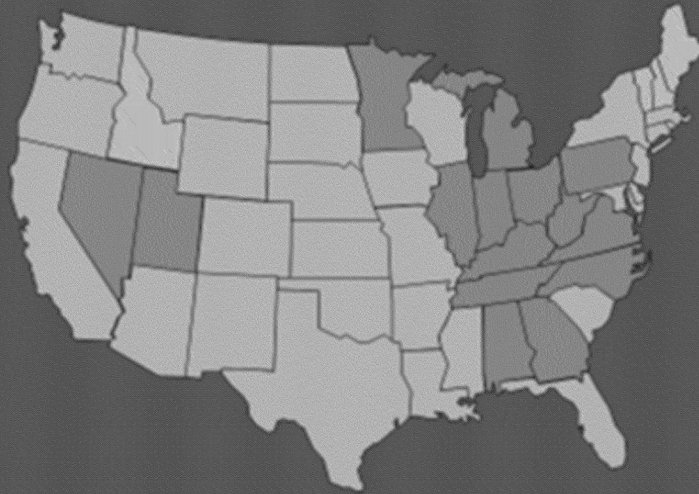
Retirements due to all causes (including EPA policies above) —

- 27 units have been added since June ... the total is now 558 units.
- These additional units represent 5,600 MW ... the total is now 93,000 MW (29% of the coal fleet).
- One state (North Dakota) has been added to the list of states with retiring coal units ... the total is now 43 states.

Age profile —

- The median size of the retiring units is 114 MW; the median age is 58 years.
- The median size of the non-retiring units is 290 MW; the median age is 40 years.

Almost 93,000 MW of coal-fired electric generating capacity (558 electric generating units) in 43 states have shut down or plan to shut down over the period 2010 - 2030.



- More than 2,000 MW of retiring coal capacity
- Less than 2,000 MW
- No retirements, including AK and HI
