## Below is a quick recap of The Energy Council's Summer meeting in Bismarck, ND last weekend:

• Radford attended The Energy Council's State and Provincial Trends in Energy and the Environment Conference in Bismarck, ND over the weekend continuing BP's support and engagement of The Energy Council and CLEER, **Center for Legislative Energy and Environmental Research**, previously held by BP Alaska's Paul Quesnel. Roughly 75+ member attendees participated in the three day meetings including legislators, commissioners and stakeholders from the twelve member states and two Canadian Provence's along with company and industry representatives. BPA is well respected, and appreciated, in this space and continue to find the sessions to be of value and offer a great platform to engage and develop relationships in a non-threating atmosphere to discuss energy, politics and policy in the respective states.

• During the opening session in the North Dakota House Chambers Friday morning in front of 75+ attendees including North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum and numerous state legislators, BP was recognized from the podium by New Mexico State Senator Carroll Leavell for our support of both TEC & CLEER.
