All,

A quick debrief on yesterday's OGCI Excom, actions highlighted. Happy to discuss:

• Headlines for Bob – a tough meeting but the report, CEO event and announcement package all agreed with no material changes.

• Questions for Bob (answers by Excom call Sept 3)

• Is he OK with Delia's suggested "pull" quote on CCS for the report, as amended by Gardiner:

"Getting CCUS to scale requires collaboration between industry and governments and involves multi-billion

dollar, multi-year investments. OGCI sees this as crucial for tackling climate change."

• Which of the speaking topics in Excom pre-read Appendix F (pasted below) does he specifically want, and not want to address, and which does he not mind (answers?

o Is he OK with final version of report which will be circulated on Friday this week

More detail....

• Overall, the culture and mindset of US companies in a different place – OGCI five years ago.

Redacted - First Amendment

• As a result there was a proposal to revisit the charter to ensure process fit for purpose. I urged against charter changes unless essential – but was told Bob has already proposed a review of OGCI governance?

• A key issue was whether OGCI had to accommodate all member views – US companies argued yes, but others concerned about risk of lowest common denominator. If charter is amended, I suggest a clause that new companies must sign up to existing OGCI positions.

• A key issue was whether OGCI is an "advocacy" organisation. Most companies argued yes, obviously, but US companies and Equinor argued no, at least not in specific jurisdictions, only "globally". This may need clarification.

• Other companies (and Jerome) had received a letter from Espinosa saying only UNSG agenda if higher ambition. Presume we also received?

A lot of emphasis (from Equinor) on the need for more action and fewer "initiatives."

• On CCUS a hard push from WS for at least 0.5 FTE human resource from each company.

• Major divergence between views on sector "purpose" – US companies for economic prosperity and modern life, others for sustainable development and poverty eradication.

• For CEO reception on Sept. 22 evening agreed CEOs + 1, companies to decide the +1. Other elements of NYC event unchanged, but greater clarity needed on which CEOs attend which events (e.g. parallel youth lunch dialogue on Monday).

• Agreed on five dialogue sessions for late afternoon Sept. 23 (NCS, stakeholders, CCUS, Methane, Transport). BP will lead on stakeholders. Dialogue leads to circulate main points to make in their session for Excom review asap.

• Greater clarity needed on what issues each CEO wants to speak to. Q&A under development. Companies to review and provide feedback on existing Q&A, and indicate CEO topic preferences by Excom call on Sept. 3.

• Report agreed with minor changes – materiality matrix won't be included as implies OGCI supports its conclusions. Circular carbon won't be referenced. Draft final report will be circulated Friday with a new CEO foreword. Sign off needed at Sept 3 Excom.

• OGCI agreed unanimously to support the WEF-led NCS Alliance. In principle keen to field a CEO at NCS Alliance launch, subject to logistics and timing. I will clarify when details available.
