Volvo leaving NMA over Clean Power Plan opposition

Swedish manufacturer Volvo Group intends to leave the National Mining Association over the group's position on the Obama administration's climate agenda.

"I can confirm that Volvo is leaving NMA," Kina Wileke, Volvo external communications senior vice president, wrote in an email to the environmental group Greenpeace.

"We do not share the NMA's view on climate change nor their opinion about the politics on climate change driven by American policy. On the contrary, we support the U.S."

The Volvo Group, which makes trucks, buses and other equipment, has for years been separate from Volvo Cars, owned by Geely Automobile Holdings Ltd.

NMA is one of the main opposition groups to U.S. EPA's Clean Power Plan and other steps to reduce carbon emissions from power plants. It is also a loud critic of U.S. participation in the climate talks in Paris.
