Hello Leslie,

Good speaking with you. Attached is a copy of Bernard Looney, our new CEO's remarks from Feb. 12 on how BP is aiming to be net zero by 2050 or sooner. Here is what Bernard said about aim 6 which includes advocating for a price on carbon.

"Aim number 6 is to more actively advocate for policies that support net zero, including carbon pricing. That will include stopping corporate reputation advertising, like the Possibilities Everywhere campaign, and re-directing the money to promote net zero policies, ideas, actions, collaborations and our own net zero ambition."
