HICKENLOOPER COMMITS TO CLIMATE: Colorado Gov. John Hickenlooper today signed an executive order committing his state to climate action, as well as announcing it will join the U.S. Climate Alliance. The executive order in question sets goals of reducing statewide greenhouse gas emissions by more than 26 percent from 2005 levels by 2025. It also aims to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from the electricity sector by 25 percent by that same year and 35 percent by 2030 from 2012 levels. In a statement, Hickenlooper said, "the vast majority of our residents, and indeed the country, expect us to help lead the way toward a clean and affordable energy future. In this process, we no doubt can address climate change while keeping a priority on household budgets."
