Context

bp continues to receive external pressure for its membership in the American Petroleum Institute (API) due to misalignments on climate policy. With a planned update to bp's trade associations review anticipated for late March 2021, bp must understand the risks and mitigations associated with withdrawing from API should the company decide to terminate its membership.

Scope and deliverables

It is important to note that a decision has not yet been made for bp to depart API. This effort aims to <u>detail risks and recommend potential mitigations</u> for bp ending its membership with API should bp decide to terminate its membership.

Stakeholders and governance

Stakeholders on the Project Team were selected based primarily on their interactions with API. Internal stakeholders to inform were selected as a representation of US business group and/or functional leaders, some with experience interacting with API.
