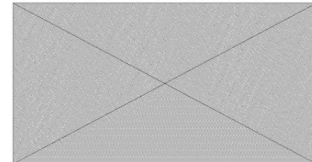
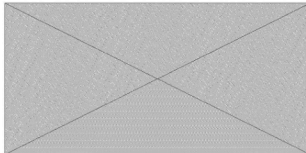

AFPM Supports House Resolution on Carbon Tax

WASHINGTON – Statement by American Fuel & Petrochemical Manufacturers (AFPM) President Chet Thompson on the House Concurrent Resolution 89, expressing the sense of Congress that a carbon tax would be detrimental to the United States economy:

“A carbon tax, or consumer energy tax, is bad for American consumers and business and this resolution makes that clear. Imposing a carbon tax will only lead to higher fuel costs – with the

largest burden being forced on lower-income households – and threatens the manufacturing of fuels and petrochemicals, which will put millions of industry jobs at risk. The net effect is that we pay more for energy and, collectively, end up poorer as a result, instead of reaping the benefits from affordable and reliable energy and petroleum products.”
