Frankly, we strongly disagree with how this has been construed by Greenpeace. You can read our statement <u>here</u>.

I also wanted to share the comment letter we submitted, which is attached for reference. As you will see, we attached a white paper that we had prepared with The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and had previously presented jointly to CEQ. The white paper, and indeed our own comment letter, focused on these points and not on the thornier and more complex issues of which and how indirect GHG emissions should be taken into account.

We seem to have been targeted because we were apparently the only integrated oil and gas company that filed its own comments rather than relying solely on trade association comments (which were only referenced generally in our letter). **Redacted - First Amendment**


