THE FUTURE OF NATURAL GAS INFRASTRUCTURE

We are holding the next EEIA Association Council VIRTUAL meeting from **1:00 PM – 2:00 PM Eastern on Tuesday, October 13**. The meeting will focus on critical questions and uncertainties around how the transition to a lower carbon economy will impact energy infrastructure investment and construction, with emphasis on the continuing role for natural gas.

PROGRAM

- **How utilities will manage the transition to low or net-zero carbon power generation, and what that means for infrastructure. Speaker: Phil Moeller, Edison Electric Institute (EEI).** Phil is Executive Vice President, Business Operations Group and Regulatory Affairs at the Edison Electric Institute (EEI). Phil served as Commissioner of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) from 2006 to 2015.
- **How transitioning to a greater role for renewables in power generation will impact demand for natural gas and for infrastructure. Speaker: Dustin Meyer, Director of Market Development, American Petroleum Institute (API).** Dustin leads API's focus on natural gas markets and natural gas infrastructure.
- **The outlook for major infrastructure projects on the drawing boards. Speaker: Toby Mack, President, EEIA.** Toby will review the status of several multi-billion

dollar projects planned or now moving through permitting, including the status of opposition-led litigation and other efforts to stop those projects from construction.
