Total's climate change report has often been appearing as sponsored posts in my social media streams in the last week, so I assume they are pushing this to energy and/or DC policy people at the moment. With that in mind, thought it would be worth flagging this as an FYI.

Key takeaways:

- The report itself provides a decent survey of standard industry positions, including the importance of natural gas, energy efficiency, etc
- It is backed by Total's long term energy forecasts, so complimentary to their other public documents
- They support for a carbon price of \$US 30-40 / ton
- They claim their objective is to have their 'low-carbon businesses' make up 20% of Total's portfolio within 20 years
- A short interview with Christiana Figueres is included, which I thought was an interesting play for credibility
