 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Midnight Rule Relief5 Act of 2012".

1 SEC. 2. MORATORIUM ON MIDNIGHT RULES.

2	Except as provided under sections 3 and 4, during
3	the moratorium period, an agency may not propose or fi-
4	nalize any midnight rule that the Administrator of the Of-
5	fice of Information and Regulatory Affairs of the Office
6	of Management and Budget finds is likely to result in—
7	(1) an annual effect on the economy of
8	\$100,000,000 or more;
9	(2) a major increase in costs or prices for con-
10	sumers, individual industries, Federal, State, or local
11	government agencies, or geographic regions; or
12	(3) significant adverse effects on competition,
13	employment, investment, productivity, innovation, or
14	on the ability of United States-based enterprises to
15	compete with foreign-based enterprises in domestic

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(b) PUBLICATION OF DEADLINES.—Not later than
 30 days after the beginning of a moratorium period, the
 Administrator of the Office of Information and Regulatory
 Affairs of the Office of Management and Budget shall
 identify and publish in the Federal Register a list of dead lines covered by subsection (a).

7 SEC. 4. EXCEPTION.

8 (a) EMERGENCY EXCEPTION.—Section 2 shall not
9 apply to a midnight rule if the President determines that
10 the midnight rule is—

(1) necessary because of an imminent threat tohealth or safety or other emergency;

13 (2) necessary for the enforcement of criminal14 laws;

15 (3) necessary for the national security of the16 United States; or

17 (4) issued pursuant to any statute imple-18 menting an international trade agreement.

19 (b) DEREGULATORY EXCEPTION.—Section 2 shall
20 not apply to a midnight rule that the Administrator of
21 the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs within
22 the Office of Management and Budget certifies in writing
23 is limited to repealing an existing rule.

24 (c) NOTICE OF EXCEPTIONS.—Not later than 3025 days after a determination under subsection (a) or a cer-

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tification is made under subsection (b), the head of the
 relevant agency shall publish in the Federal Register any
 midnight rule excluded from the moratorium period due
 to an exception under this section.

5 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

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7 (1) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
8 meaning given that term under section 551 of title
9 5, United States Code, except that such term does
10 not include—

(A) the Federal Election Commission;
 (B) the Board of Governors of the Federal
 Reserve System;

14 (C) the Federal Deposit Insurance Cor-15 poration; or

(D) the United States Postal Service.

17 (2) DEADLINE.—The term "deadline" means
18 any date certain for fulfilling any obligation or exer19 cising any authority established by or under any
20 Federal statute or rule, or by or under any court
21 order implementing any Federal statute, regulation,
22 or rule.

(3) MORATORIUM PERIOD.—The term "moratorium period" means the day after the day referred
to in section 1 of title 3, United States Code,

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1	through January 20 of the following year, in which
2	a President is not serving a consecutive term.
3	(4) MIDNIGHT RULE.—The term "midnight
4	rule" means an agency statement of general applica-
5	bility and future effect, issued during the morato-
6	rium period, that is intended to have the force and
7	effect of law and is designed—
8	(A) to implement, interpret, or prescribe
9	law or policy; or
10	(B) to describe the procedure or practice
11	requirements of an agency.
12	(5) RULE.—The term "rule" has the meaning
13	given that term under section 551 of title 5, United
14	States Code.
